## Our Story

**I**n the aftermath of World War II, Rudolph Quiñones and his young wife, Adel, were looking to make a life for their young family. As a G.I. fresh from the U.S. Army, Rudolph feared his family's future was not in San Antonio, but to the north. Fate, however, did not want them to leave their beloved city and led them to the idea of opening a restaurant.

They began at a small location on Wilson Blvd. with a dining room that seated sixteen. They named it "Jacala" which can be translated to 'little hut' after a favorite village in Mexico.

There began the Jacala family tradition. Rudolph was in the kitchen perfecting what would become the family's signature enchiladas while Adel made sure the customers kept coming back.

As the restaurant's reputation for great food grew, so did their clientele. Eventually, more dining space was needed. Once a small grocery store, the current home of Jacala has undergone the additions of three dining rooms, a patio and our beautiful outdoor courtyard.

Though Rudolph and Adel are no longer with us, their children have carried on the family business. Jacala is now the oldest originally owned Mexican restaurant in San Antonio.
